Dear Parishioners.

What a joy! The month of May has arrived. It is a month of exams; it is a month of graduations; it is a month of baseball and other sporting activities; and it is a month that we anticipate school closings and summer vacations. But in the meantime, let's just enjoy this time that God has given to us this May, 2024.

One of the qualities that God desires that we have is one of joy. In our gospel, Jesus tells us "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete." After reading such a statement, we might wonder how do we get that "joy?" He tells us in that same gospel, we will receive that joy when we remain in His love, always keeping His commandments. Also, in the announcements from the Bishop, you will find that I have concluded my appointment as Dean of the Quincy Deanery while retaining my duties as pastor of St. Peter and Chaplain at QND. After many years as Dean, I asked that I be relieved and let a new face fulfill this role. In place of Fr. Zach, Fr. Paul L. Lesupti is appointed parochial vicar of St. Peter Parish, and Associate Chaplain of Quincy Notre Dame. He has been serving the Cathedral in Springfield as a parochial vicar since his ordination two years ago with Fr. Zach. Please welcome him with open minds and hearts as he begins his service with us on the 1st day of July, 2024.

As of last weekend, we are beginning to wrap up the active fund-raising phase of the **Upon this Rock** campaign. I want to thank all of our parishioners and school families for their support. We had our Commitment weekend last weekend and some of parishioners responded with pledges and/or donations. We are still hovering around the 25% participation rate of parishioners participating. 
St. Dominic Junefest

Continuing on my theme for this campaign, we have raised \$6,219,173 towards our total goal. As I said, there is what I call a participating challenge by a donor who has pledged another \$150,000 if we have 500 parishioners participating in this campaign. As of last weekend, we have 440. Will you help us? We need 60 more parish families. And lastly, I ask for all of you to pray for this project. It will be a tremendous asset to our campus here at St. Peter Church, providing a secure cafeteria, a renovated parish center, and much needed classroom space.

As we look ahead, 8th grade graduation for St. Peter School will be Tuesday, May 14th, at 6:00 p.m. in the Church. Our closing Mass for our PSR students is Wednesday, May 15th, at 6:30 p.m.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This May, our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). Please prayerfully consider supporting the collection this year. Fifty percent of collected funds stay in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and the other 50 percent support communications projects in the United States and around the world.

Through Catholic Times, social media, podcasting, and other digital methods, our diocese is taking advantage of several communication outlets to spread the news of our diocese, teach the faith, and provide hope and encouragement to people no matter where they are in their faith life.

Followers on the diocesan social media channels continue to grow. Our channels have far more followers than most dioceses our size, and several that are two to three times as big as our diocese. For example, our Facebook page has neared 11,000 followers (we had about 3,000 followers five years ago).

In 2020, our YouTube channel had under 500 subscribers. Today, it is approaching 5,000 subscribers. This shows that the content our Curia team is producing is engaging, inspirational, and educational, and people want to consume it because it is helping them.

For example, a search on YouTube for "How to go to Confession," has a video from our diocese in the top five for answering that question, with more than 145,000 views. Dive Deep, the official podcast of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, has listeners all over the world, and recently was endorsed by EWTN which placed Dive Deep on their podcast central webpage. God is Alive, a documentary produced by our Communications team, was featured in several national media outlets this past year.

With your generosity, we can continue creating engaging content and bringing people closer to our faith or even back to our faith.
