Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 22, 2024 Dear Parishioners,

As we gather this weekend, the Church celebrates the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our readings today challenge us to look deeply into our human nature, and when we do, we find characteristics that are not becoming of who we would like to be. I was thinking that we so often don't like to clutter our living space with items that make the space look junky and trashy. So we usually hide things in the basement, far from the sight of others. After all, we want to impress others rather than to present a negative image of ourselves. Well, in a sense, our readings are asking us to look into the basement of our lives, and be challenged to uncover and rid ourselves of things accumulated and acquired over the years of living as a human being. For example, our first reading from Wisdom explores the hatred that builds up in ourselves and is evident when we are in the presence of someone who lives how we should live and we don't. Remember in grade school how certain classmates were picked on because they were as we mockingly called them "teacher's pets." When in fact, all they were doing were following what was expected. Grade School, High School, or even in adulthood, we often hold out resentment for these people who are doing right. That's a commentary more of ourselves than them. Then in our second reading, Paul confronts the basement of our lives as he speaks of jealousy and selfish ambition, sources of war and conflicts, of hatred and a complaining spirit. Then finally, in our gospel, Jesus forces His disciples and us to look deeply into our lives to that area of pride and self-importance. After Jesus just finished about speaking of the cross, making a very profound declaration, the disciples were arguing among themselves as to who would be the greatest among them. Wow! So much for our human nature. Fortunately, Jesus doesn't give up on them nor on us. He takes us where we are with the rubbish in our basements, and challenges us to a new way of living, putting aside the old and living His works, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

Bishop Paprocki will be in Quincy on Tuesday, September 24th, to celebrate the All Catholic Schools Mass at QND at 9:30 a.m. All the Catholic Schools in the area will gather to celebrate a Mass, with the Bishop and Priests of the area, to reflect our unity with each other. You are more than welcome to attend as the celebration will be in the QND gym.

Next weekend, Sept. 28-29th, we are celebrating "Priesthood Sunday" as we gather to celebrate the liturgy and to pray for Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. Our priests have been encouraged to speak of their vocation to the priesthood and share a little of their vocation story. In light of this theme, we will be having a Holy Hour for Vocations in St. Peter Church from 6:00-7:00 p.m. I encourage you to come and pray for more vocations.

Our second class for our OCIA process will be this Tuesday, Sept. 24th, from 7:00-8:30 p.m. in the Martha Jane Room (below the Church and next to the Cafeteria). If you missed the first class, there is still an opportunity to be a part of the process of discovering more about the Catholic Church. Again, there is not pressure or arm twisting, only an openness to God's grace and call in your life.


QND Extravaganza



October 6th, 2024 | 2:30 pm | Between 14th & 16th Broadway

Please join with other area pro-life supporters in peaceful public witness as we stand for 60 minutes praying for our nation and for an end to abortion.

Pick up your sign at the corner of 16th and Broadway between 2:00 and 2:30 pm. Please park on 16th Street or Vermont. We ask that you position yourselves two arm's lengths apart along the South Side of Broadway Between 14th and 18th Streets Do not stand in groups Bring a lawn chair only if unable to stand. This event is an opportunity to stand for life and is held in more than 1,400 cities in the United States. Please remember this is an hour of silent prayer.

For 35 years, pro-life Christians across the United States and Canada have publicly, prayerfully, and peacefully stood in prayer and repentance on behalf of legalized abortion each fall. From its small beginnings as a local witness in California, the Life Chain has spread to more than 1,000 locations all over North America.
