Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 20, 2024

Dear Parishioners.

Well, the weather is changing and it seems that Autumn (Fall) is here to stay and will be with us for a while. The days are getting shorter and we have recently had a touch of frost. Looking forward to the trees changing and we begin to see God's handiwork in nature take place right before our eyes. Enjoy the beauty of God's creation.

Remember the phrase, "if you don't look after yourself, no one else will." I thought of that phrase when reflecting upon our gospel reading for our Mass today. Two of Jesus' apostles approach Him with a request. They begin the request by asking Him to do whatever they ask of Him. This statement probably put Jesus on the defensive, thinking now what are they going to ask. The two of them then ask Him, "grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Have to give these two apostles credit as they were fulfilling the words of that phrase about "looking after oneself." I can just imagine Jesus scratching His head and then saying to them, "can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" Of course both of them said that they could although neither one of them understood fully what was ahead of both of them. Then we hear that the other ten, when they heard this request became "indignant" at them. Perhaps they reacted the way that they did because they didn't think of the request first. Whatever the case, it became a teaching moment for Jesus. Jesus told them and tells us, "whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many." This is not an option for us but a call to a mission or life of service. In order for us to do the same, we must set aside that phrase in our lives because our life of service is not about me, but how I can serve others.

Last week, I heard some distressing news as Monica Scholz informed me that she will be leaving us as Director of Music/Liturgy in order to fulfill a life long dream of teaching once again. I am very sorry to see her leave as she provided a service to our parish that will not be forgotten. I consider the music program for our liturgy one of the best in our diocese and Monica will be missed. I ask your prayers as we begin our search for a new full time director of music/liturgy. There will be a job description in our bulletin for this week concerning this vacancy. If you know of anyone who might be interested, please let me know. But in the meantime, keep us in your prayers that we will be able to attract a person who will fulfill the many expectations of such a position.

Besides the music position, we are still pursuing the employment of a parish nurse. Although this position is part-time, there are many roles that this position fulfills as we meet the needs of the homebound, the sick in the hospitals, and the aged in our nursing home facilities. If you know of someone who could provide such loving care, please let me know.

We welcome all the QND students who are here with us for our 5:00 p.m. Mass before their Homecoming dance.


PRESCHOOL 3-YEAR OLDS LEARN ABOUT COMMUNITY HELPERS


