Pentecost Sunday, June 8, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." With these words from the Acts of the Apostles, the Church was born. Jesus has returned to the Father. And in a dramatic scene, we find the apostles being filled with the Holy Spirit, the Spirit promised by Jesus, a Spirit that prompted each of the apostles to proclaim the good news. I still remember as a young person in grade school, picturing in my mind these gifts of tongues descending upon the apostles on that first Pentecost. At that time, I didn't comprehend the symbolism of the tongues. The tongues of fire represent the arrival of the Holy Spirit, signifying the power and transformative presence of God upon the disciples. Fire is always a symbol of transformation. The tongues of fire then, resting on each of the disciples, symbolize the empowerment of the apostles to speak in other languages and proclaim the wonders of God to all nations. The arrival of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the apostles begins the birth of the Church. To all of us who proclaim our faith in the Catholic Church, then Pentecost is our birthday, so "HAPPY BIRTHDAY" to all of you. And thus begins our role as people who have been confirmed in our faith and thus empowered to proclaim the good news by our own lives.

As we reflect upon Pentecost in our own lives and our particular role in the Church, this day I recall my ordination to the priesthood, May 31, 1975, the day that called me to live out my vocation as a priest of the diocese of Springfield, Illinois. On that particular day, God filled me with the Holy Spirit in my life to challenge me to live my vocation in service to His people and His Church. On the day of my ordination, I am not sure what the Lord wanted from me, nor did I think I was worthy of His calling. In spite of my feelings, the Lord reminded me over and over these past 50 years that my vocation wasn't about me, but rather about how He could work in and through me. And I struggled through the years to try to get out of the way and allow Jesus to work in and through me. I often failed but the beautiful part of my vocation is that the Lord never failed me and always challenged me to let go and trust in Him. Did I do this willingly? Not always as I kicked and screamed at times but it was God's grace that remained steadfast and "amazing." And so after 50 years of service, I give God thanks for His calling of me to the priesthood and remaining always loyal to me through good times and in bad times, giving me a glimpse of His love and His presence especially in the people whom I served. And so today I am thankful to God for His vocation to the priesthood. His gift of priesthood was truly a gift helping me to know, love, and serve Him in this world and in His Church. His gift of priesthood was a gift to me as I discovered in the people whom I served His love and His presence through their encouragement, prayers, and support. And His gift of priesthood was a gift to me through my parents, my siblings, my family, and the extended family in my life, namely, those whom I served and helped me to be the priest Jesus wanted.


Totus Tuus


