Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 21, 2025 Dear Parishioners,

After a short break to celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, the Church returns to "ordinary time" as it celebrates the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our gospel for the weekend is always an interesting gospel as it highlights someone who ends up cheating the master of the house and benefits himself. It seems that Jesus ends up commending the cheating person for behaving prudently. Even though it makes little sense in terms of being an upright and just person in dealing with things of this world, yet, in terms of this world and worldly behavior, the cheating person ends up receiving praise for serving himself in terms of worldly behavior. But what Jesus ends up concluding through this parable is that we can serve only God or wealth, and whichever one we choose has authority over us, for good or ill. So how can we know which master we are serving? As Jesus states, "you cannot serve both God and mammon."

A good steward is the parishioner who is thankful for all that God has given to him/her. He/she is thankful for the gift of time in which we enjoy life, happiness and love. He/she is thankful for the talents bestowed upon them, talents to be used for the sake of others and not for oneself. He/she is thankful for the treasures earned and received, and open to being able to share them with others. If we are good stewards, we are truly serving God and not ourselves. Let's be those stewards as God challenges us to be a people of thankfulness and gratitude, and thus enabling our stewardship to be reflected in all of our live. And when we do, God continues to bless us in so many ways.

We want to welcome to our parish celebration this weekend the Junior Raiders. These young men are the Raiders of tomorrow as they learn the basics of the game of football. And one of those basics is a solid foundation of our Catholic faith. It is always so great to see our football teams center their lives around the celebration of the Eucharist.



Our Church mourns the terrible suffering of Christians and other innocent victims of violence in Gaza and surrounding areas who are struggling to survive, protect their children, and live with dignity in dire conditions. The Holy Father continues to call for a cease fire and for aid to enter the territory, noting with great sorrow that "Gaza is starving."

The Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) is there providing vital emergency humanitarian relief and medical and psychological care for the sick, malnourished and wounded.
