Second Sunday of Advent, December 7, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

We gather on this Second Sunday of Advent in the words of St. John the Baptist, to “prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths.” So, on this Second Sunday the Church introduces us to that Advent figure of John the Baptist. He was a figure who wore clothing made of camel’s hair with a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey, an interesting menu from the desert in which we find him. But there was something about him that made him very attractive, as people gathered around him to hear his message and to be baptized by him as they acknowledged their sins. As he met so many people coming to him, he challenged them to produce good fruit as proof of their willingness to change. Advent then becomes a time of change for us, changing from living in terms of this world only and somehow making our lives ready for the coming of Christ. There is hope for all of us. In our first reading from Isaiah, the prophet uses an image of a sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom. If you ever travel through the forest or woods, you will encounter fallen trees. And what we would find in these fallen trees, are blossoms sprouting forth from the remnants of the tree, new life in the midst of brokenness and death. That is the hope Isaiah provides, helping us realize that new blossoms can still bud in our lives. This is our hope for Advent as we await the Lord whose coming gives us life and helps us bear fruit.

This Monday, December 8th, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. It is a Holyday of Obligation for all Catholics. But because the vigil of this Solemnity falls on a Sunday, the Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence so there is NO VIGIL MASS ON SUNDAY EVENING. Our Mass schedule for the Holyday is as follows: 8:20 Mass at St. Peter, 10:30 Mass at QND, 12:10 Mass and 6:00 p.m. Mass at St. Peter Church. Please join us for our celebration as we honor Mary under this title as the patron of our diocese and our country. Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, pray for us.

As we announced at our Masses last weekend, our Advent parish mission needed to be cancelled. The sudden death of Fr. Zehnle necessitated that we cancel our mission, especially since his death affected the life and vocation of our mission presenter. So, I ask you to pray for him and we will try to reschedule our mission in the future.

I also want to address an issue with you regarding Mass attendance when the weather is not conducive to being out and traveling in it. I remind you, especially the elderly and the sick, that they are not obliged to attend Mass when it’s impossible to be present because of ice and snow. Just please stay home under these circumstances and don’t risk getting out and falling and breaking a hip or leg. Under such circumstances, please stay safe at home. It is not a sin to stay home when the weather or road conditions make it difficult. The Church does not ask the impossible of us.

If you haven’t turned in your stewardship commitment cards, there is still time to do so. Please take them to prayer and ask our Lord to help you discover what He is asking of you this year. Mail or put it in the collection basket.

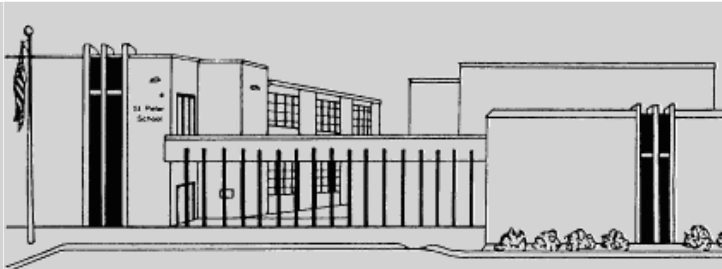
